


NEW ZEALAND EXPERIENCE PATHWAY APPLICATION FORM



You may be eligible for the New Zealand Experience pathway if you do not have a formal qualification but have seven years of full-time work experience as a plumber, gasfitter, or drainlayer. **You will need to complete the application form, submit all required evidence, and pay the application fee before your application can be reviewed.**



EVIDENCE CHECKLIST



Things to consider when gathering your evidence:

- each piece of evidence should be saved in a separate PDF file and clearly named
- providing a good range of quality evidence can make the assessment process easier and quicker to complete.
- where specified your evidence needs to be a certified copy. A certified copy is a photocopy of an original document that has been officially declared to be true and correct by a lawyer, Justice of the Peace (JP), or Court Registrar.
- complete each checklist to make sure that you submit all the required evidence

WHAT TYPES OF EVIDENCE SHOULD YOU SUBMIT?

You need to submit evidence showing that you have the required:

- full-time work experience in each trade you apply for.
- knowledge of the competencies for each trade you apply for.

This table outlines the types of evidence you need to submit to show your knowledge and experience.

<input type="checkbox"/> Reference letters showing that you have the required full-time experience in your trade. Your reference letters need to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• be dated, and signed by your referee• cover the required number of years required for your trade, with exact dates (dd/mm/yyyy) of employment• list specific plumbing, gasfitting, and/or drainlaying work that you carried out• verify that you have completed the work carried out in any photo or video evidence that you submit.
<p>The Board may contact your referee if they have questions. Your reference letter needs to include the phone number or email address of your referee.</p>

<input type="checkbox"/> Certified copy of your confined spaces certificate/training
<input type="checkbox"/> Other relevant evidence such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Building Consent Authority site inspection paperwork or testimonials from Council inspectors.• photos or videos showing a range of work that you have completed. (needs to be verified in your reference letter or with you being in the photo). Any photos or videos need to include a description, date, and location showing where the work was completed.• job cards verified by supervisor.• original or certified copies of invoices, tax records, contracts, design plans, council/territorial authority plans, quotes, consent/permits, etc.• certified copies of any relevant training or upskilling that you have completed eg. asbestos, solar heating, supplier training.
